
Family Engagement Champion of the Year

Program of the Year



Provost Elementary

Provo School District
Boys & Girls Club of Utah County

The Boys & Girls Club of Utah County program at Provost Elementary was built by the school librarian, who recognized a deep need for students to reconnect, build confidence, and rediscover joy through afterschool activities.



Serving between 250 and 300 students each year, Provost's program offers a variety of student-driven clubs—from musical theatre and sewing to Dungeons & Dragons, science, mock trial, and coding. Every semester, students take part in a showcase that celebrates their growth, talents, and hard work. They also perform a musical with a cast of 65-70 students for the entire school and other audiences.

Visitors to the program are amazed at how much confidence the kids in the program have after being tutored by amazing staff. Teachers have reported that students day time attendance and testing scores have improved because of this program.

Their impact as a program is evident through recent parent feedback:

"This is the first time my son has ever been in an afterschool program and I see a change in him. He is more confident and is already asking me if I can sign him up again. Thank you for your program.

It has made a difference in my son's life."

"...I hope the school and the Boys and Girls Club recognize their incredible value here so that we can continue this special program and allow future students to be enriched in the same way that our child was this year."
