## Considerations & Tips

As many shared buildings and schools make alteration for COVID-19, some afterschool programs have been left without a location to provide activities. Others need to make accommodations for the space they normally would use.



Use the considerations and tips below to help you find a location to host your program or to make adjustments to fit requirments.



- Carefully review all CDC, state, and Child Care Licensing recommendations as you think about what space could work for you. Some considerations include:
  - Be mindful of the number of youth the space will safely be able to accommodate
  - Will you be able to keep youth from different schools separated
  - If needed, are you able to install barriers or partitions to properly separate groups?
  - Is there appropriate space to maintain social distancing during activities and transitions?
  - Will the space be easily cleaned often?
  - Is there a space youth may be isolated if they become sick?
- Work with schools and or contact local religious institutions, city or county recreation facilities, private or charter schools, and other similar facilities to utilize unused space.
- Consider offerings that may already be in place in the community you aim to serve. If you are unable to find your own location, you may be able to partner to provide activities that complement and supplement what is in place.
  For example: partner with a sports league looking to implement academic and social & emotional support to the youth they serve.
- Have a back up location if plans fall through
