

AFTERSCHOOL IN UTAH

- Decrease in CCDF (29%) and 21st CCLC (2%) Funds
- Reallocation of State Funds
- Sunsetting ARPA Funds
- 41% Decrease in Funding


Afterschool & Summer: Essential Support for Families*

Demand for Afterschool & Summer Programs*

For every 1 child in an afterschool program in Utah, 8 more are waiting to get in.

320,040 children would participate in an afterschool program if one were available.

 133,052 children would participate in a summer program if one were available.
